Albuquerque International Sunport



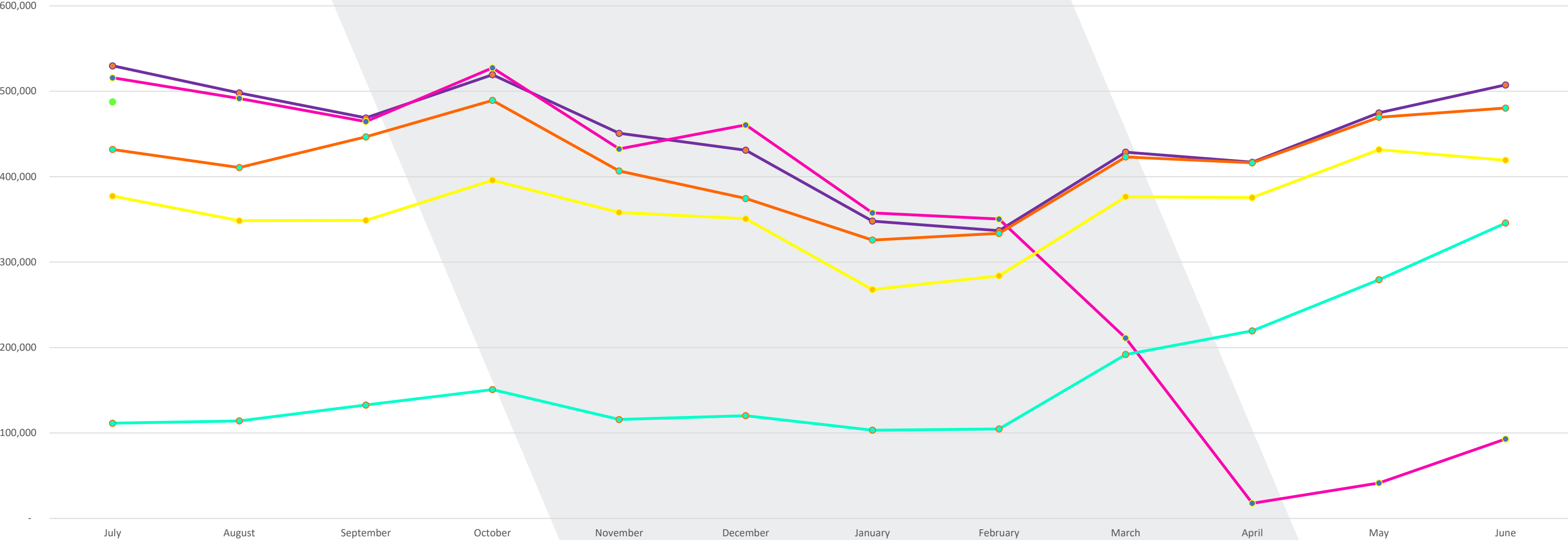
- Owned and operated by City of Albuquerque Aviation Department

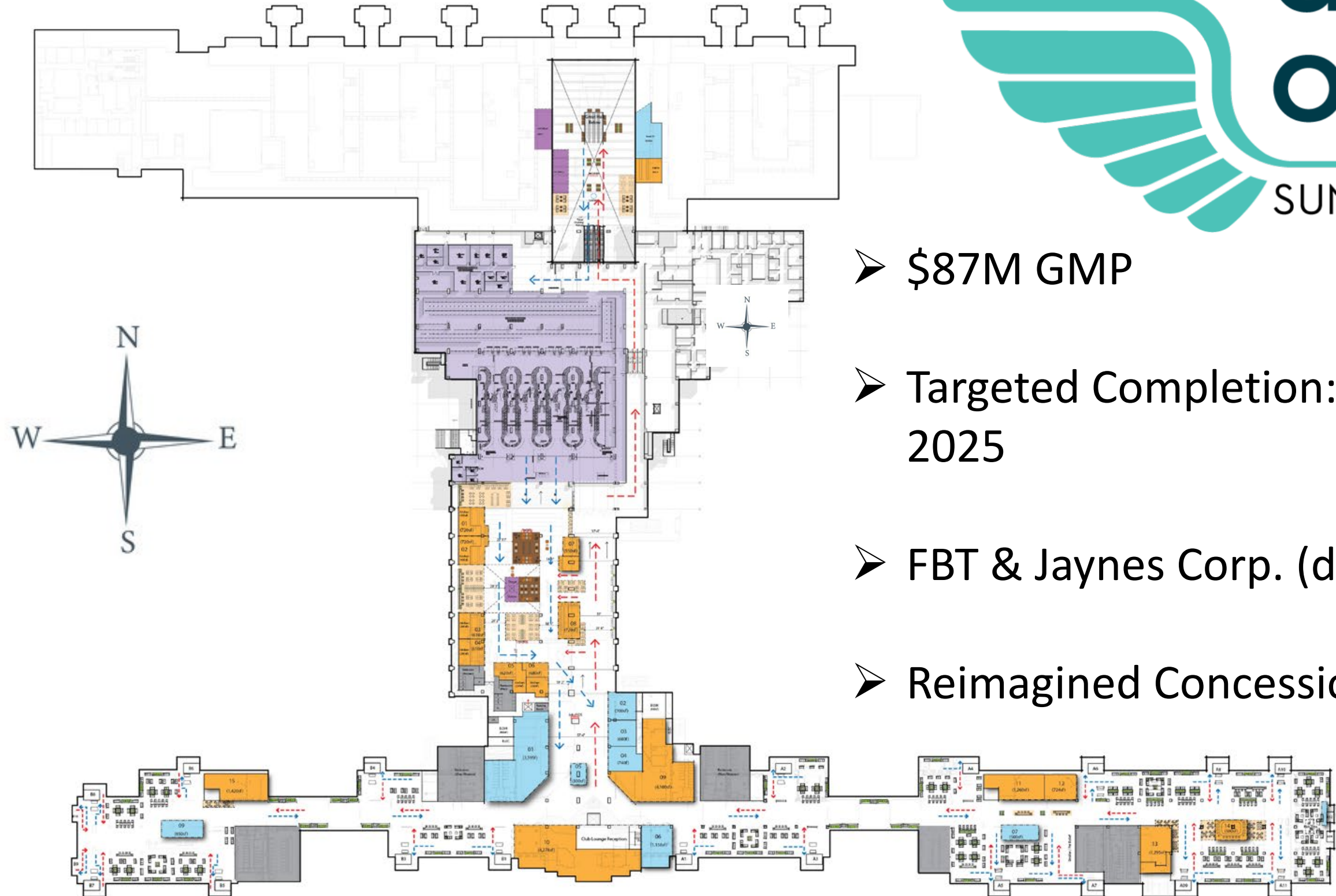

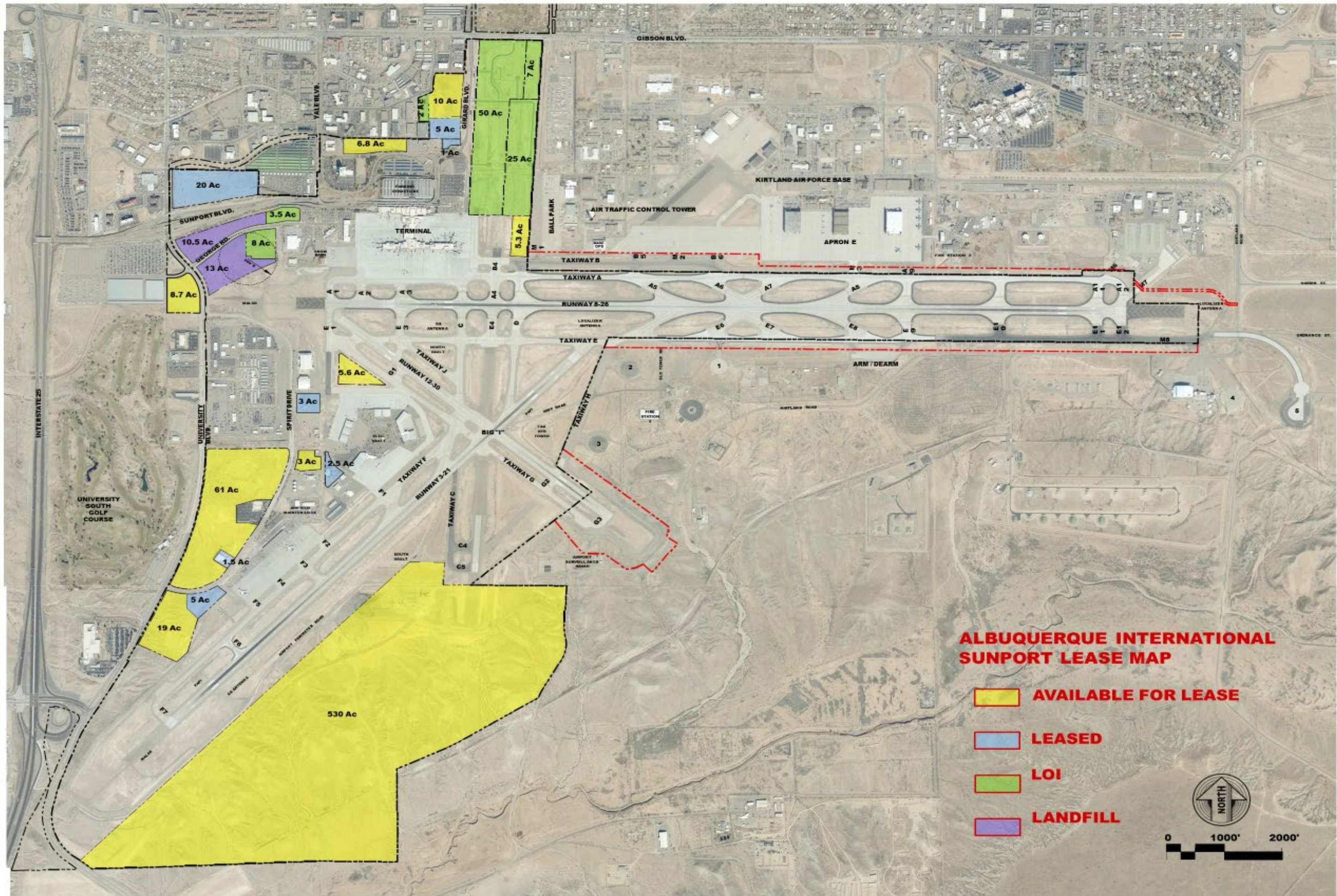

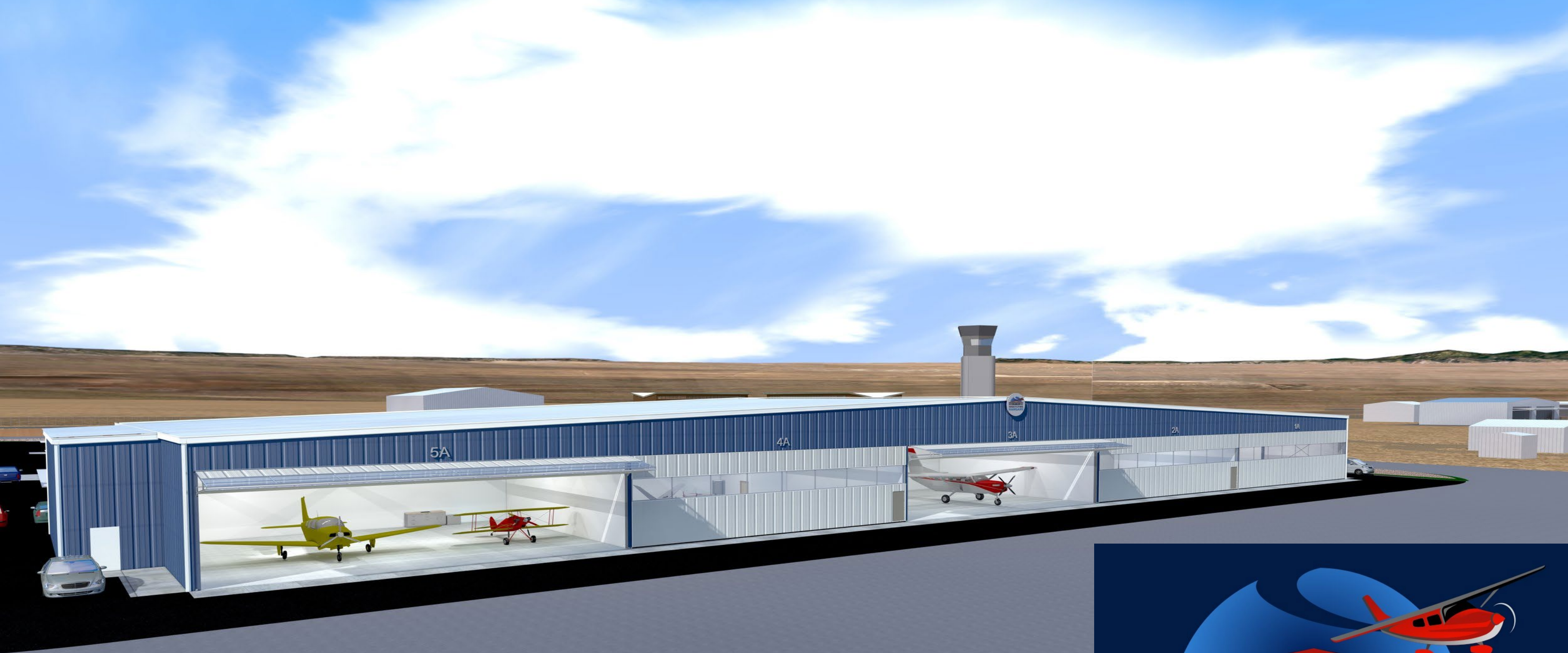
