Sandoval County is one of the fastest growing communities in New Mexico with highly-rated schools, low crime rate, low cost of living, diverse population, competitive incentive programs, and a rich culture. Rio Rancho is the largest city and economic hub of Sandoval County. Centrally located, Rio Rancho borders Albuquerque and is an hour from Santa Fe and within 30 minutes of the Albuquerque International Sunport.

Sandoval County has proven to be a beneficial place to do business and is home to standout companies such as Intel, HP, Lectrosonics, Insight Lighting, Ideum, US Cotton, amfabsteel, Geobrugg, and MCT Industries.

LABOR FORCE

Sandoval County pulls labor from the Albuquerque MSA region, with an available labor force of 362,876 within a 30-minute drive from Rio Rancho. The average commute for a worker within the Albuquerque MSA is 30 minutes, meaning workers are willing to travel that amount of time to get to their location of work.

The workforce of Sandoval County is well educated and highly diverse. Nearly 66% of adults (25-64 years of age) have some college education. Of the total population, 42.5% of Sandoval County residents are Caucasian, 39.9% Hispanic, 14.1% Native American, and 3.5% another ethnicity.*

EDUCATION AND TRAINING

Sandoval County offers some of the best schools in New Mexico and increasingly offers a range of indemand Career Technical Education (CTE) programs and dual enrollment with local colleges. RRPS' CTE offers a variety of programs including Health Science, Automotive, and Energy, among others. Rio Rancho High School and V. Sue Cleveland High School, part of Rio Rancho Public Schools, are currently ranked nationally on the U.S. News & World Report's list of Best High Schools. The University of New Mexico Health Sciences Center (UNM HSC) and Center of Excellence for Orthopaedic Surgery, Central New Mexico Community College (CNM), and New Mexico Highlands University (NMHU) have campuses in Sandoval County. All offer career training across industry sectors and are committed to working with employers to develop certification and training programs toward industry needs, while shaping the workforce of the future.

INCENTIVES

The State of New Mexico, Sandoval County, Rio Rancho and the Town of Bernalillo offer competitive and unique incentives to job creators to help reduce the overall cost of doing business. These include the Local Economic Development Act (LEDA), Industrial Revenue Bonds (IRBs), and the Job Training Incentive Program (JTIP).

RESEARCH & DEVELOPMENT

Sandoval County is located between two national laboratories – Sandia National Laboratories and Los Alamos National Laboratory. Both offer licensing and technology transfer programs as well as support programs to teach skills in entrepreneurship and commercialization while identifing opportunities that lead to new technologies, products, and businesses. Additionally, both offer support to small businesses interested in working with the labs.
