Albuquerque Regional Economic Alliance (AREA) focuses on your business' success in the community, whether you are new to the four-county region or have been operating here for decades. Companies with a presence already in the community are responsible for up to 80% of future new jobs which creates a healthy local economy and provides a strong quality of life for our residents

To creatively support the business community in the four-county region, AREA offers a robust Business Retention and Expansion (BRE) Support program that includes a business outreach program, focused workforce and talent attraction tools, informational events and webinars, public relations and marketing support.

Additionally, AREA can help companies access and apply for local incentive and workforce training programs as well as state level tax





WHAT WE DO

AREA's Business Retention & Expansion Support Program is a *free* service designed identify the needs of local employers and connect you with resources and solutions to remove barriers to growth. In many cases, insights gained in visits with local companies have resulted in the creation of completely new programs and services that help companies succeed and thrive in the region.

Central to the program is an *in-person visit* where WE come to YOU at your business and ask for one hour of your time or less. It will be prefaced with a short survey to gauge your company's anticipated needs, and if appropriate, may result in local state public, private, and non-profit affiliates joining the discussion to maximize your time and the benefits we can offer.



WHAT WE DO

Our visit includes AREA's BRE team and depending on anticipated needs identified for your company prior to the visit, we may involve other local and state public, private and non-profit affiliates. We will be interested in meeting members of your leadership team as well as any others you would like to invite, such as your facilities or human resources managers.

The confidentiality of information or comments you share with us is our top priority, so rest assured we have that covered. After we better understand your company and its unique needs, we will focus on immediate follow up on any urgent matters. We have many success stories to share from helping companies fill key positions to providing proprietary economic and demographic data helping a company avoid relocation.

INCENTIVE PROGRAMS

AREA's team assists economic-base businesses in the Albuquerque area with their expansion plans, connecting them to the tools and resources they need to succeed. Whether your firm needs assistance with financing, workforce training, or state and local incentives, a member of AREA's team should be your first call.

LAND, BUILDING AND INFRASTRUCTURE INCENTIVES

Local Economic Development Act (LEDA) – Qualified entities are eligible for LEDA grants to assist expanding or relocating businesses. LEDA funds can help companies purchase, lease or improve land building and other infrastructure.

WORKFORCE TRAINING INCENTIVES

Job Training Incentive Program (JTIP) – A program of the state's Economic Development Department, JTIP helps fund classroom and on-the-job training for new jobs in expanding or relocating businesses for up to six months. The program reimburses 50% to 75% of employee wages at eligible companies.

Workforce Innovation & Opportunity Act (WIOA) – WIOA was enacted with the intent to ensure that all Americans have the training they need to qualify for good jobs and to successfully manage their careers. WIOA can assist employers with their training needs though customized and on-the-job training.

TAX CREDITS AND DEDUCTIONS

High Wage Jobs Tax Credit (HWJTC) – Provides businesses with a tax credit equal to 8.5 percent of the value of salaries for each net new job paying a net taxable wage of at least \$60,000 per year in communities with a population of 60,000 or more.

Manufacturing Investment Tax Credit – NM tax law provides a credit equal to 5.125 percent of the value of qualified equipment and other property used directly and exclusively in manufacturing.



FINANCING AND TAXES

Finance New Mexico | financenewmexico.org

Finance New Mexico provides free and low-cost business assistance for startup and established businesses. They provide resources and business building tools including steps to starting a business guide.

DreamSpring | dreamspring.org

DreamSpring provides access to business credit and training for entrepreneurs and is known for "micro-lending." The organization provides loans in many New Mexico communities.

Capital Certified Development Corp. | capitalcdc.com

Capital Certified Development Corporation (Capital CDC) is a leading private, non-profit provider of business financing solutions throughout New Mexico and Texas.

Enchantment Land Certified Development Company | elcdc.com

ELDC administers the SBA 504 loan program in New Mexico. Loans can be obtained for land, buildings and equipment. Your business puts up a minimum of 10 percent, the SBA provides up to 40 percent at a fixed rate, and your bank provides the remaining 50 percent and becomes the first lien holder.

Export-Import Bank of the United States | exim.gov

EXIM is an independent federal agency that fills gaps in private export finance in order to boost U.S. job growth. EXIM provides trade financing solutions including export credit insurance, working capital guarantees and guarantees of commercial loans to foreign buyers. New Mexico businesses are served by EXIM's Houston field office.

The Loan Fund | loanfund.org

Formed in 1989, the New Mexico Community Development Loan Fund is a private, tax-exempt organization that provides loans, training and business consulting to entrepreneurs, business owners and nonprofit organizations throughout the state and the Navajo Nation. Their services support the efforts of low-income individuals and their communities to achieve self-reliance and control over their economic destinies.

NMCC invests in New Mexico companies that can deliver marketrate returns while creating social and economic improvement in the communities where they operate. NMCC targets growing sustainable naive economies through investments focused on water, energy, food, agriculture and health.

New Mexico Finance Authority | nmfinance.com

Through its Smart Money Loan Participation Program and in partnership with the state's Economic Development Department, the NMFA leverages funds provided by New Mexico banks for businesses in order to create quality jobs.

New Mexico Tax Research Institute | nmtri.org

The New Mexico Tax Research Institute educates policymakers and the public about taxation issues in the state. It conducts research, publishes papers and hosts conferences to keep New Mexicans informed about tax policy.


Employers can connect CNM Job Connection Services to post job openings and internships on an online job bank, arrange on-campus recruitment events and reach CNM students and graduates.
