









2024 Population by Race/Ethnicity









STEAM Education & Workforce Development



Explora X Studio has been created to provide equitable access to opportunity from cradle to career by providing a STEAM learning campus for Albuquerque youth. Explora X Studio will:

- Improve educational outcomes
- Drive economic development
- Increase family and community prosperity

Winner of the 2024 Hopkins Award for Excellence in Ethical Practice by a Non-Profit

The new campus will prepare students for the workforce and STEAM careers, employ under-represented young adults in STEAM-related jobs, accelerate innovation and entrepreneurship, and generate private investment. While still a few years away, a second phase of Explora's "Cradle through Career" campaign is in the works. Plans are underway to build Brillante Early Learning Center. Brillante will be New Mexico's only fulltime, museum-based child care and early learning center, providing care for children 6 weeks old through the pre-Kindergarten year.

Average Commute Times








CASE STUDY:



array

Array Technologies is a global provider of renewable energy solutions that has been leading the way in the industry for over 30 years. In January 2022, they acquired STI Norland, making them the largest solar tracker company in the world. Their focus is on utility-scale solar trackers and they are dedicated to generating energy with integrity for a sustainable future. Array officially announced a \$50M+ move into a new 216,000 SF manufacturing and headquarter facility in Albuquerque to expand its production of solar tracking systems. This move was supported by taxable industrial revenue bonds (IRBs) and Local Economic Development Act Funds (LEDA) from state and local agencies. This move nearly tripled the company's office and manufacturing space in Albuquerque.

Industrial Revenue Bond (IRB)

For companies making large capital investments in New Mexico, an IRB could provide significant abatement of real and personal property taxes, as well as exemption of compensating (use) tax and/or gross receipts (sales) tax for equipment purchases. Terms vary by community.

Job Training Incentive Program (JTIP)

Direct cash reimbursement for 50-70 percent of trainees' wages for up to six months of on-the-job training. Additionally, a significant portion of customized training provided by a New Mexico post-secondary public education institution is eligible for reimbursement.

LEDA Fund Grants

The Local Economic Development Act (LEDA) provides for state and local deal-closing funds targeted toward employers that can demonstrate additional funding is needed to close a competitive cost gap. LEDA closing-fund grants can only be used for reimbursement of eligible expenditures tied to land, buildings and infrastructure.

Factors considered include the number of full-time, privatesector jobs, net new payroll, employee benefits, capital investment, and expenditures for local goods and services.
