
# **Community Overview**





## **Torrance County** | New Mexico

Located east of Albuquerque, Torrance County is one of the most productive agricultural counties in the United States. Pinto beans, corn, alfalfa, and pumpkins are just a small portion of the crops, which are harvested throughout the year. Torrance County is also home to the beautiful Manzano Mountains, Salinas National Monument and vast open, undisturbed rangeland which farmers, ranchers, and wildlife call home.



### **County Overview**

As of 2023 the county's population increased by 0.4% since 2018, growing by 407. Population is expected to increase by 2.6% between 2023 and 2028, adding 407.

From 2018 to 2023, jobs increased by 9.1% in Torrance County, NM from 3,708 to 4,046. This change outpaced the national growth rate of 3.6% by 5.5%. As the number of jobs increased, the labor force participation rate decreased from 46.1% to 43.1% between 2018 and September 2023.





## How many employees do businesses in Torrance County have?






